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A message from Meg

The students at Illabo Public School continue to amaze me with their effort and application towards learning. Our recent school public speaking competition is an example of this. All students K-6 bravely presented a speech to the whole school audience. The standard of the speeches blew Miss Callow, Mr Dahler and I away! We were very impressed with the amount of time and effort that had clearly gone into them and enjoyed listening to how much our students had learnt about our Multicultural society. Our K-2 students experienced speaking in front of an audience and were encouraged by the older children. Everyone did a great job and we were extremely proud of them. Congratulations to Maeve, Asha, Finn and Nell for recording the highest scores in Stage 3 and Stage 2 respectively. They are now representing IPS, in Cootamundra on Thursday, at the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking competition. Thanks to Scarlet who is stepping up to replace Nell (due to Nell's unavailability).

Last week the students were given their post-test for the termly Spelling Challenge and the positive growth from all students has been pleasing. The introduction of 'Word of the Day' and a focus on spelling in our classrooms, along with obvious support from parents during home learning, has led to a deeper understanding and application of spelling strategies.

Today my Stage 3 class was asked to reflect on their learning of the new spelling program and here are some of their responses:

Zoe – We got 9 weeks to practice all our words that we got wrong and then we did another test. I improved by 30 words. I got 75/100 and I'm quite surprised and I was happy all my hard work helped me improve.

Maeve – Finally at the end of the term we redid the spelling test (this was our post-test). I improved by 14 words which was pretty good but I did make a couple of silly mistakes, which goes to show you should always double check!

Tom – In the post-test I improved by 22 words which was the 2^{nd} biggest growth in 5/6. In the end I got 90/100 which I was pretty happy about. Overall it was a pretty good way to learn and helped me quite a lot.

Our learning habit this week is **Accountability.** When we are accountable, we own our decisions and understand that our choices and actions impact on the people around us. We are willing to stand up for what

we think is right. We feel a sense of responsibility to the people and the world around us.

For our last week of term our focus will be **Social intelligence**. When we practice this habit, we know when to learn alone and when to ask others for advice. We know how much and what kinds of interaction it takes to get the job done. We can see that there are some things that cannot be done with others.

As this is the last Newsletter of the term, I would like to publicly thank the staff and parents at IPS for being so supportive of me during this term. Megan, Michael, Nathan, Julie and Kim have been great to work with and I thank them for their obvious commitment to the students at IPS. I have enjoyed getting to know the parents and some of the wider community members of this great little school.

UNSW ICAS Assessments 2019

We have registered for the UNSW Global Parent Payment System. The Parent Payment System is a simple and secure online payment service specifically for parents to purchase ICAS Assessments. This means that all assessments are purchased through the ICAS website and not through the school. Assessments are available to purchase for students in Years 3 to 6. The assessments will be conducted at school in Term 3. The following assessments can be purchased for your child:

- Digital Technologies Tuesday 3 September 2019
- English Tuesday 17 September 2019
- Maths Thursday 19 September 2019
- Science Thursday 5 September 2019
- Spelling Thursday 12 September 2019
- Writing Tuesday 10 September 2019

The cost for each assessment is \$14.50. Closing date for assessment purchases is **Monday 12 August**. All assessments this year will be online, except for Writing in Years 3 and 4 which will be a pencil and paper test.

More information, including our unique school code, will be sent home over the next couple of days (once received).


Did you know?


