2. Go to your local branch or Mobile Library with ID (if you are under 18 years of age you will require the ID and consent of a parent, guardian or guarantor)
3. Receive your library card. You can now borrow up to 30 items for a month from any of our 19 branches (and Mobile Library) or download eBooks, eAudiobooks, magazines, and stream movies from home

ATTENDANCE MATTERS – Notes of Explanation

Parent/s or caregivers are required by law, to provide an explanation to the Principal within seven days of any absence, as to why their child was not at school.

- * It is important that the school receives a written explanation because:
- * It is a parent's legal obligation to explain their child's absence within seven days
- * It is a requirement that the school investigate all unexplained absences including persistent lateness

- * It avoids the school and the School Attendance Officer from making unnecessary investigations
- * It is the way the school knows that your child was legitimately absent and not truanting from school
